**Ride Start:**

*We will begin staging riders at 9:45AM based on distance of ride*

10:00 AM - Classic Ride Start  
10:05 AM - Sprint Ride Start  
10:10 AM - Family Ride Start

*Note: There are a lot of riders coming into a small town, so plan to arrive early to park and get checked in!*

**Parking:**

Parking attendants will be directing traffic into the Red Eagle Distillery parking lot. Please do not park across the street at the winery or on South River Road. There is plenty of parking for everyone at the Distillery!

**Important Ride Notes:**

- The ride is a Fondo style event, it will be timed with published results. However, it is not a race, there are no ride awards. We will announce the top three women and men in each ride.
- Helmets are required for all riders while on their bikes.
- Front Light (White Blinking) & Rear Light (Red Blinking) are strongly encouraged.
- We will have limited support from the Ashtabula County Sheriff's Department and a limited number of course guides on the route. Know the route before you ride. See the Ride With GPS links below.
- Traffic will not be controlled, please observe all city, county & state traffic laws and Rules of the Road. All riders must watch for and yield to traffic.

- Riders are responsible to ride on the correct side of the road and to be especially careful when proceeding into an intersection and road crossing.
- All riders will be provided with a ride number, please mount the number on your handlebars. Do not trim, fold, bend or crease your ride number.
- There will be two Rest Stops: mile marker 12 (Dewey & Thompson Roads) and mile marker 29 Beaumont Scout Camp. Riders are encouraged to carry at least two water bottles. Rest stops will be stocked with water, Hammer Electrolyte Drink Mix, Hammer Energy Gels, cookies, bananas, and snacks while supplies last.
- There are no restroom facilities on the 12 and 22.5 mile routes. There are porta potties in Beaumont Boy Scout Camp close to the 28 mile mark. In addition there is a porta potty close to mile mark 33 in the parking lot at the intersection of Jefferson Eagleville Road and the Western Reserve Greenway Trail.
- All courses close at 2:30 PM.

### Timing & Results:

The Red Eagle Gravel Grinder is a Gran Fondo, meaning that it is not a “race”, but timing and results will be provided. There are no USAC points and no awards for winners.

### Gravel Etiquette and Recommendations:

- Please do not litter. All riders are responsible to pack your gel & energy bar wrappers, water bottles etc.
- Please be courteous to allow automobiles to pass.
- When passing other riders or pedestrians please announce yourself by saying “have a great day”.
- When riding in a group and you can safely point out road hazards or obstacles, please call them out to your fellow riders.
- Issues may arise during the ride, we highly encourage you to carry a cell phone, navigation device, printed map, spare tubes, and patches. Be prepared to rescue yourself.

### Medical:

Medical professionals will be onsite to manage any minor injuries that may arise. Each rider will also be given a wristband with an emergency contact phone number for the sag vehicle and medical. While out on course, if there is a severe medical emergency, please dial 911.

### Post Ride Festival:

Please bring a folding chair and come prepared to enjoy our improved after party! Enjoy your first cold beverage (beer served in your souvenir pint glass) on us along with a cup of chili provided by the Red Eagle Distillery. The distillery restaurant will be open at 1pm, and Rabbit Food, a vegetarian food truck, will be joining the festivities from 12-2:30pm.
